Our Impact

In 2021, NOC Society was able to offer the Drive Forward program to the largest number of individuals to date.

This past year, the Drive Forward program had a total of **267 participants**.

There were **partnerships from 10** Indigenous communities, employment skills training programs, and organizations. Our partners funded the participation of their clients in the Drive Forward program.

What the L! workshop- virtually or in person, was offered 23 times which results in the participation of **184 individuals**.

83 participants received driving lessons and prepared for the N license road test through the Drive Forward program. All costs were covered by our generous partners or through sponsorship from NOC Society.

Graduated License Program (GLP) certification was obtained by 8 youth in our DF program.

A total of **54 participants successfully passed the road test and obtained the N license.**
